

Professional Licensure Program Disclosure Policy

In accordance with federal regulations outlined in 34 CFR § 668.43, the University of Sioux Falls, is committed to providing transparent information regarding our professional licensure programs. This policy is designed to ensure that prospective and current students have access to relevant details about our programs, particularly in relation to licensure and certification requirements.

Program Disclosure:

The University of Sioux Falls offers professional licensure programs that prepare students for careers in fields requiring licensure or certification. As part of our commitment to compliance with federal regulations, we provide the following disclosures:

1. Program and Licensure Information:

4. Location of Learning:

Students are required to verify their physical location for learning at the beginning of each semester to ensure that every student is in compliance with the policies outlined by NC-SARA and federal regulations.

The physical location of a student plays a crucial role in determining their eligibility for enrollment in programs that lead to licensure or certification. If a student resides in a state where the University of Sioux Falls does not meet or has not assessed the requirements for licensure or certification at the time of enrollment, they will not be admitted to the program unless they can attest that, upon completion of their degree program, it is their intention to work in a state where USF has confirmed licensure or certification eligibility.
