Q: Who is eligible for a media studies scholarship?

A: High school seniors who will be enrolled full-time in the coming year as a media studies major or minor are eligible to submit a media portfolio to be considered for a media studies scholarship.

Q: What do I need to include in my portfolio?

A: Depending on your area of interest, please submit the requested number of samples from one of the following categories:

- Print: 3-5 print articles (reviews, reportage or opinion pieces)
- Video: 2-3 stories or projects shot and/or reported by you
- 2D/3D or Motion Graphics: 3-4 animation or motion graphics projects
- Graphics: 3-4 infographics, social media posts or ads, posters or graphic artwork
- Photos: 10 photos and/or a published photo essay
- Layout/Design: 2-3 pages

Feel free to submit work in more than one category.

Q: What should the formatting look like in my portfolio?

A: Please feel free to exercise your creativity in your portfolio presentation! Successful portfolios can be housed on a website and include videos, graphics, PowerPoint presentations, Google slides or PDFs. All submissions must be accessible digitally, either on a website, a Google Drive or a Dropbox folder.

Be sure to include:

- Title of work
- Year created
- Medium used
- Picture of work (if applicable)
- Dimensions (if applicable)

Q: What are faculty looking for in a media portfolio?

A: Faculty are looking for:

- Original work
- Creativity
- Variety of subject matter
- Finished pieces
- Versatility in a range of different media
- Ability to express an opinion, a narrative, a mood, an emotion, perhaps a political statement, etc.

Q: When will I know what I'm being offered?

A: Results are mailed about two weeks following the portfolio submission.
